Our Membership Model



Our one star Membership is suitable for individual parents, students or educators only. It includes:

- online training workshops
- access to the Members' area of the Connect website.



Two star Membership is for groups that don't get involved in fundraising or events. It includes:

- online training workshops
- basic insurance (Public and Employer's Liability insurance)
- access to the Members' area of the website
- the opportunity for your group to nominate a parent or teacher to the Board of Connect.



Three star Membership will suit most parent groups. It includes the benefits of 2 star Membership plus a comprehensive package of membership-linked insurance benefits. Members receive:

- free information & training sessions
- Fidelity & money insurance
- Personal Accident cover for helpers
- All Risks cover for items you buy for the group or school
- Public Liability cover for up to five activity groups or clubs.



Four star Membership gives you all of the benefits of 3 star and more. For very active groups, it includes:

- Extended Public Liability for stall holders and entertainers
- Additional Public Liability Cover if your Parent Council/PTA runs 6 or more activity clubs/groups
- access to Connect's PVG services
- specialist advice from our insurance broker on managing major events.

The Protection of Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme

Connect Members often contact us with queries about the Protection of Vulnerable Groups scheme. There is confusion about how the disclosure system works and whether it is OK to use the PVG Membership Scheme for parent group volunteers. We are happy to help with all PVG queries.

Connect is an Intermediary Body for Volunteer Scotland, so if your group has four star Membership and your volunteers need to join the PVG Scheme, we can help you deal with all the paperwork and liaise with Disclosure Scotland and Volunteer Scotland on your behalf.

Insurance Q&As: See www.connect.scot for more

Q: We're planning to have a bouncy castle at our fete, but we want to make sure our insurance would cover us. Can you help?

A: 3* and 4* Connect Members have insurance cover for events and activities such as this, as part of their benefits. If you are planning to have an inflatable at your event, you **MUST** do a risk assessment and follow our *Guidelines for Bouncy Castles & Inflatables* leaflet

<http://bit.ly/connectinflatables>. However, you need to remember that you cannot insure against accidents! The public liability element of your insurance covers against claims for incidents that happen **as a result of negligence only** – for example, if someone is injured because you didn't operate the inflatable safely.

Q: We're holding a barbecue at our school summer fair and the headteacher says we need a Food Hygiene Certificate. Is this true?

A: If you are cooking food on school premises or in the grounds (such as a barbeque), you do not need a Food Hygiene Certificate for your Connect membership-linked insurance to be valid, although of course you should follow best practice in preparing and cooking food. However, the local authority can require you to have one as a condition of the school let if, for instance, you are using the school kitchen. Check the conditions of the let. Q: We're organising a fundraising car wash on school grounds. Does our Connect membership-linked insurance cover us for damage to the cars?

A: Car washes are covered for 3* and 4* Members by your membership-linked insurance. As with all activities, you should carry out a risk assessment to make sure you are taking reasonable precautions to avoid damage to vehicles. About Connect

Background

Connect was formed 70 years ago to campaign for parental involvement in education. We continue to champion this cause, working to make family engagement in children's learning as good as it can be. Connect is a charity and a limited liability company with a Board of Directors.

Funding

Our income comes mostly from membership fees, from around 2000 parent groups like yours. Membership fees pay for the office staffing and the Regional Advisor team, office space and equipment, our website, our resources for parent groups and for running Information and Training sessions for parents. Of course, it also pays for membership-linked insurance which we buy on behalf of our Members.

Staff

Connect's staff team is small and is totally focused on helping parents to be involved in their child's education. Our office team is based in Edinburgh and is responsible for the organisation of all parts of our work. We also have a team of enthusiastic Regional Advisors around the country. They lead our Information & Training Sessions for parent groups so if you take part in one of these, you'll meet at least one of our lovely team!
